Attendees of this workshop were able to receive and overview on understanding more about the functions of behavior as well as how to avoid, decrease or increase a behavior.

JULY 4, 2013 – Tomorrow's Voices Junior Staff attends Sunsmart Workshop - Junior Therapist Tarik Bean-Darrell attended a half day training put on by Bermuda Cancer & Health to promote a sun safe summer camp. The information Tarik was provided at the workshop was presented to the TV staff to ensure that the clients and staff attending our summer camp were kept safe from sun exposure during outdoor activities and outings.



JULY 9 TO AUGUST 26, 2013 - Tomorrow's Voices Summer Programme - Tomorrow's Voices hosted their Summer program for the fifth consecutive year. The Summer program served 12 children with various abilities ranging from Autism to developmental disabilities to Down Syndrome. Students aged 3 to 21 years participated in weekly outings, water play, cooking, language games, sports day, and many other activities that challenged them to have a happy and healthy summer.

SEPTEMBER 9, 2013 - Parent Training & Support Group Meeting. Tomorrow's Voices Senior staff hosted a Parent Training and Support Group to provide parents with information on "What is ABA", "What is Behavior" and further topics to empower parents with knowledge to increase parent advocacy.

SEPTEMBER 25, 2013 – Tomorrow's Voices hosted the workshop "Encouraging positive behaviour from the children in your classroom and home". Attendees of this workshop received and overview on Token Systems and Behavior Contracts: Useful Behavior Analytic Strategies for the Classroom and Home Environment.

OCTOBER 5, 2013 – Tomorrow's Voices 3rd Annual "Bounce For Autism" Fun Day – We hosted our 3rd Annual community fun day at the Southampton Rangers Sports Club Over 600 children and their parents attended the event which featured opening speeches from the Minister of Health and Seniors, the Hon Pamela Gordon Pamplin, JP, MP, and the Minister of Education, the Hon Nalton Brangman, JP. The PHC Majorettes, water slides, bouncy castles and a number of other bouncy activities. The day turned out to be entertaining for the entire family.



OCTOBER 9, 2013 - Tomorrow's Voices provide Workshop to the Department of Youth & Sport Afterschool Programme Co-ordinators - The Department of Youth and Sports
